

Modified CAR T-Cells Show Promise in Neuroblastoma

A team led by Shahab Asgharzadeh, MD, and Babak Moghimi, MD, developed a modified version of CAR-T that shows promise in neuroblastoma—sparing healthy brain tissue and effectively killing cancer cells. The preclinical study, published in Nature Communications, took advantage of the gating properties of SynNotch CAR T-cells.

New Findings on Cisplatin Hearing Loss Risk

Etan Orgel, MD, MS, led a multicenter study on hearing loss in over 1,400 youth treated with cisplatin. The study—published in The Lancet Child & Adolescent Health—identified clear atrisk populations and found that *how* cisplatin is given, not just total dose, influences risk.

Factors Affecting Survival in Rhabdomyosarcoma

Leo Mascarenhas, MD, led a Children's Oncology Group study looking into the clinical factors influencing survival in children with localized FOXO1 fusion-positive rhabdomyosarcoma. Patients older than 10, with large primary tumors, had the poorest prognosis.

First Results From Hemophilia Trial

Guy Young, MD, and a group of international colleagues reported the first results from a phase 3 clinical trial of nonacog beta pegol (N9-GP) in previously untreated patients with hemophilia B. Inhibitor incidence was 6.1%, with 68% of patients experiencing zero bleeds.
